## Breakfast event considers 'What a Trump Economy Means for Us'

Community and business leaders will look to the future of the economy at the Sixth Annual Economic Forecast Breakfast, presented in partnership with the Greater Gardner and Nashoba Valley chambers. Sponsored by Fidelity Bank, it will be held on Wednesday, April 12, 2017 from 7:45 to 9:30 a.m. at the Double Tree by Hilton, 99 Erdman Way, Leominster.

Keynote speaker is J.D. Foster, Ph.D., chief economist of the

U.S. Chamber of Commerce, who will head up the breakfast with his presentation on "What a Trump Economy Means for Us." Foster spent five years in the White House as chief economist at the Office of Management and Budget. Foster has also served as economic counsel for tax policy at the U.S. Department of the Treasury and as legislative director to Rep. Crane (R-IL), vice chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means of the U.S. House of Representatives.

His experience also includes serving as chief economist of the Tax Foundation, one of the nation's oldest and most respected nonprofit research organizations, and chief of staff at the White House Council of Economic Advisors.

Foster writes extensively on tax policy and entitlement reform, as well as on matters of monetary policy and international economics. He received a B.A. in economics and a B.A. in mathematics from the University

of Colorado, an M.A. in economics from Brown University, and a Ph.D. in economics from Georgetown University.

He has been active in economic research for more than three decades, and has served as an associate editor for the "American Economic

Plan upgrades and downgrades are allowed effective April 1 or May 1. You must finalize your alternative choice before April 30, 2017 for a May 1, 2017 effective date. After May 1, off-anniversary downgrades are only available with 75 day advance notice.

Please note some plans will have significant benefit changes effective April 1, 2017. Intermediary plan changes were mailed in late January. Please share the information in these documents with all your benefit-eligible employees. Some new options offer lower monthly premium rates for your business. ## **Steve Duvarney**

Duvarney Jewelers has been a continuous retail operation since 1854, and Steve Duvarney represents the third generation to own it, since 1934 when his grandfather bought the High Street, Clinton store. His father opened the Fitchburg site, at 457 Main Street, in 1970. "I grew up in Clinton and Lancaster," says Duvarney, and "worked at the store during college." He received a B.S. in business management from UMass Amherst.

On the Chamber board, he says that he, "wants too get a feel for the direction of the Chamber in the next few years and see where I can lend my expertise. I'm interested in economic development. I'm on

the board of directors at Hometown Bank and I'm very involved in local businesses (and) our region's economic health. A chamber needs to have some retail involvement."

Duvarney has played a leadership role in the opening of the Fay Club, which was shuttered for some time when membership in the social club dwindled. "We have reorganized the Fay Club with a different business model. Dues have been lowered and we're looking at a wider membership, now up to about 360, to expand utilization of the club," which has long

been an iconic, historic building on Main Street in Fitchburg.

Duvarney is active in professional associations, serving on the board of the New England Guild of the American Gem Society and as president of the Boston Jewelers Club. He also volunteers with the Fitchburg State University Foundation.

When not at work, he "plays golf once in awhile," but spare time is rare in his busy family. He and his wife Shelley have a 13 year old and 8 year old twins, and Shelley is a quality control specialist at Fidelity Investments. The family enjoys summers at the shore and whenever they can, a trip to Disney.



#### Governor Baker's Employer Health Insurance Assessments

As part of his FY2018 budget proposal, Governor Baker unveiled a change to the health insurance marketplace that might significantly impact small businesses. The proposal would require businesses with more than 10 employees to offer health insurance and cover at least 60% of the premiums. In addition, 80% of employees must utilize that coverage. If the employer does not meet those requirements, they could be assessed up to \$2,000 per employee that is not on the company health plan. The Governor's proposal is intended to reduce the amount of insureds on MassHealth, the state's biggest budget buster.

The proposal is widely seen by the business community as bad policy, and goes against the philosophy of "fair share" health reform. The Affordable Care Act expanded access to publicly subsidized health insurance, even if there is a health plan offered by an employer. We will be actively monitoring this proposal and updating members on the potential impacts it could have.

### **Tourism Budget Cuts Disrupt Tourism Marketing**

As part of his mid-year budget cuts, Governor Baker trimmed \$98 million of the state budget. Part of that cut was a "sweep" of the Tourism Trust Fund – a special fund by the state legislature aimed to secure dedicated funds for marketing to visitors. The trust fund sweep included a \$3 million cut to funding for Regional Tourism Councils. The Johnny Appleseed Trail Association (JATA) saw a 50% decrease in state funding as a result of the budget cuts.

"Tourism is the third largest industry in Massachusetts and has a profound impact on our local communities," said Roy Nascimento. "We're disappointed in the administration and hope our legislative delegation will help restore these critical dollars."



In North Central Massachusetts, visitors spend \$127 million dollars at destinations and attractions. Those dollars support 900 jobs directly, and thousands of jobs and small businesses that are supported by the visitor industry. Funding from the state office of travel and tourism support JATA's marketing efforts, including trade show participation and targeted advertising campaigns.

#### **Chamber Speaks on Behalf of Game On Fitchburg**

Game On Fitchburg – the commercial soccer complex proposed for West Fitchburg made it through a critical step in the project planning process. The Fitchburg Planning Board approved the soccer complex's special permit during their January 17th meeting. The project will transform the Westminster Hill area to an indoor and outdoor sports complex, which will be a significant driver of sports tourism in Fitchburg.

"It is not often that a project of this scope and size is presented to a community," said Chamber President Roy Nascimento. "This is an opportunity for the City of Fitchburg – and the entire region – to take on economic growth."
