

Board Member Profile -

Anne Leader

"Keep it local" is one Chamber mission that Anne Leader has always embraced, and for good reason. She is co-owner, with her husband Len, of Vision Payroll in Leominster, and she grew up in a family that truly "lived" the concept of customer service. Her father, the late Dr. Robert Fallon, founded the veterinary clinic in Lunenburg of the same name in 1963. It's all about empathy.



"As kids, we got used to people with sick pets showing up at that door at 1 a.m." she notes.

Ms. Leader met her husband when they both attended the College of the Holy Cross, where she earned a B.A. in economics. She went from college to work and a managerial program at Jordan Marsh, eventually heading the store's women's fashion department and then becoming a buyer of domestic goods.

The couple are parents of three sons, and when they were young, she states, "I had to leave (retail) because of the traveling and crazy hours. During those years I helped my dad in the clinic, doing the books...." As Len is a CPA, the two had a broad network of business contacts, and Ms. Leader continues, "We saw a need (among them)... for a smaller, accessible payroll company." Their sons were growing up, so the couple wanted "to provide a payroll firm with more personal customer service."

They were able to "start very small, by word of mouth," about 15 years ago, and today, the company employs over a dozen people who focus on a broad range of industries--and are mostly within the local area.

Ms. Leader is passionate about growing the local economy. "I like the Chamber's economic development efforts," she notes. "The Chamber has been super at putting programs together. We regularly send our employees to these events. It is where local (business) people can meet other local people... and that's how you expand your local economy. I always give my business to my clients or other local business owners. It's about keeping money in Central Mass... Area business growth needs that.'

Sports have been important in Ms. Leader's life. "I did youth sports for a long time, coaching soccer, basketball, Little League, track & field," and she played basketball in college. "Sport activities," she adds, "build great (team) unity and help (kids) deal with pressure and getting along with others. Those skills translate to all things in life--school, work...'

She and Len help out with the "Impact Melanoma" organization, which supplies education, prevention and support to skin cancer patients. When not at work, she and the family travel extensively--aiming for all 50 states and seven

continents. Travel, she insists, "means always learning something new."

Drone Racing League selects North Central Massachusetts for 2017 Allianz World

Fitchburg will be hosting the Drone Racing League (DRL) as the official New England site of one of its six 2017 Allianz World Championship races that culminate in a winner-take-all World Championship event.

"It's very exciting that Fitchburg was selected by DRL to host their 2017 drone racing series," said Mayor Stephen DiNatale. "This selection is testament to the strong partnerships that we have in place here in North Central Massachusetts and our region's strengths in the robotics and video gaming industries."

DRL discovered the Fitchburg site after meeting with the Johnny Appleseed Trail Association at a national trade show for sporting events. North Central

Massachusetts is an emerging sports tourism location, so strategic investments have been made to attract events and exhibitions in this region.

"We looked around aggressively for a community to host our New England race site," said Ashley Ellefson, director of operations for DRL. "Fitchburg was the ideal location and the Johnny Appleseed Trail Association, the North Central Massachusetts Chamber and the City of Fitchburg were all amazing in support of our efforts."

Given its rapidly growing worldwide audience, the biggest benefit of securing the DRL race will be the national and global

exposure for Fitchburg and the region. DRL's first season reached millions of fans around the world, including more than 30 million broadcast viewers on the major sports channels and more than 43 million views of its digital content. The region will also benefit from the hotel rooms booked for staff and media, and the new direct spending in the region by the visitors associated with DRL.

DRL joins a growing list of companies that have recently selected North Central

Massachusetts, including Great Wolf Lodge that selected Fitchburg for its New England location; AIS that recently moved its operation to Leominster; Nypro that chose Devens for the expansion of its medical device manufacturing operations; and most recently the developers of Game On Fitchburg that selected West Fitchburg as the site of their major indoor sports complex scheduled to open in 2018. North Central Massachusetts also recently received national recognition for its efforts by industry professionals who plan sporting events.

Annual Economic Outlook Survey Results Released

Businesses & consumers consider economy under President Donald Trump

Over 250 guests joined the North Central Massachusetts Chamber of Commerce and Fidelity Bank at the DoubleTree in Leominster in April to get an idea of what the future holds for the economy under the current administration. The Economic Forecast Breakfast featured the results of economic outlook surveys, one of local business leaders and one of consumers from across North Central Massachusetts. The breakfast sponsor, Fidelity Bank, conducted the surveys.

The event also featured presentations from two experts in the field. Dr. J.D. Foster, vice president, Economic Policy Division and chief economist of the US Chamber of Commerce, provided keynote remarks with his presentation: "What a Trump Economy Means for Us." Foster noted that burdensome regulations,

review periods and negative perceptions that businesses held of the last administration have been a boon to feelings about the economy, according to Foster's analysis.

Jeff Fuhrer, executive vice president and senior policy advisor at the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston also spoke about the state of the economy and its outlook specifically for Massachusetts.

Survey results for both consumers and business leaders pointed to the political climate playing a significant role in the economy. The two groups differed somewhat on President Donald Trump's impact on the economy, as

53% of consumers felt it would be negative, while 58% of business leaders feel that the president will have a positive impact on the economy.

Consumers did not have overwhelmingly positive feelings about a rising economy, with



76% of respondents indicating that the economy would be the same or only somewhat better in a year.

Although the survey revealed that consumers believe that the high cost of living will be a threat to economic growth, only 22% of consumers believe that in 2017 they will be spending less money, while 44% believe they will not make any change to their spending habits.

The availability of skilled labor in the region was a major concern for business leaders. Workforce issues were the top challenge that businesses expect to face in the next two years, and was high among the greatest threats to economic growth for respondents.

"You can see from the survey that consumers have leveled off on Trump's impact to the economy," said Chris McCarthy, President and COO of Fidelity Bank. "In comparison business leaders have a more positive outlook on the upcoming year."

Half of business leaders surveyed did indicate they would be increasing capital investments in their business in the next year. Investment priorities for business in 2017 include equipment, new hires, training, and expansion.
