

Chamber hosts economic development tour

One stop on the tour included a visit to Laddawn at Devens. The national firm manufactures a diverse line of plastic packaging products. Chamber staff including President Roy Nascimento participated, as well as Nam Pham, assistant secretary of the Office of Business Development & International Trade for the commonwealth; Mark Sullivan, executive director of the Mass. Office of International Trade & Investment (MOITI); and Peter Milano, senior director of business development at the Mass. Office of Business Development.

A group of 25 diplomatic and commercial representatives the North Central Mass. Development Corporation (NCMDC) and the Johnny Appleseed Trail Association (JATA), co-hosted the event along with the Mass. Office of International Trade and Investment (MOITI). "The event provided an opportunity to introduce foreign diplomats to North Central Massachusetts and promote the region as a great place to live, work, visit or grow a business," noted Chamber President Roy Nascimento. "We have a number of international businesses already thriving in our region and believe that this is a dynamic area for any industry."

The tour also included a trip to the summit of Wachusett Mountain and concluded with a special reception with business leaders hosted by Wachusett Ski Area at their base lodge.

James Vander Hooven

James Vander Hooven, Ph.D, has taken over the reins as president at Mount Wachusett Community College in Gardner, after the retirement last year of Daniel Asquino. He was previously vice president for enrollment management at Landmark College in Putney, Vermont. Prior to joining Landmark College, he was president of Tohono O'odham Community College, a tribal college



located on the Tohono O'odham Reservation in Arizona. He has held administrative positions at Lakes Region Community College in Laconia, New Hampshire, and at National American University in Denver, Colorado.

Vander Hooven attained his B.A. in English from Ohio State University and an M.A. degree in American studies from the University of Wyoming. In 2009, he was awarded his doctorate in higher education leadership from the University of Maine, where he focused on student access.

He believes educational institutions play an active role in the business community. "Colleges should be at the table and play a big role with business and industry in meeting their need for workplace training," he points out. This includes a broad range of fields, "from medical and advanced manufacturing to human resources and customer service."


The advantage of a community college, he states, "Is that, after identifying a need, we can respond rapidly," to provide training for any kind of business. "I believe that in a month, we can put on a workshop, and do it at a MWCC site

or at (the client's) facility. We had a discussion about how to help a business in town," he continues. "For them, training (employees) during business hours wasn't possible. Why limit a workshop to business hours if that doesn't work for everybody," he explains, noting that a class can be offered during a third shift.

"The role I would envision for myself on the Chamber Board of Directors is to help meet the needs (for employee training) of our local businesses."

Microloan program becomes more accessible to Gardner

The Chamber's economic development arm, the North Central Massachusetts Development Corporation (NCMDC), and the Greater Gardner Chamber of Commerce recently signed an agreement to partner. The collaboration involves the NCMDC providing start-up and existing small businesses in the Gardner area with access to its microloan financing programs, which provide loans of up to \$150,000 to help businesses that may not meet traditional lending standards. The Greater Gardner Chamber will provide the NCMDC with marketing support and a presence in their office for their loan officers to counsel potential clients.

"We're really pleased to be able to partner with the North Central Massachusetts Development Corporation on this loan program," said Jim Bellina, president & CEO of the Greater Gardner Chamber of Commerce. "This is a great resource to support businesses and economic development in the greater Gardner area. The NCMDC's track record and commitment to growing new and existing businesses in North Central Massachusetts have played an important role in our expanding regional renaissance.

Chamber announces 'Blueprint' for government affairs

The Chamber recently unveiled its Public Policy Agenda for the new fiscal year--outlining the Chamber's legislative priorities on issues important to businesses and the advancement of North

Central Massachusetts. The agenda was developed to serve as a blueprint for the Chamber's government affairs efforts and have been reviewed and approved by the Government Affairs Committee and Board of Directors.

"The passing of a new budget and opening of the fall legislative session presents us with new

challenges and opportunities," Christopher McDermott, the Chamber's public affairs manager, explained. "We look forward to facing these head on and this document provides the road map we'll use to do so."

The Chamber advocates on behalf of businesses across the region, and the new Public Policy Agenda outlines a platform which builds upon the area's competitive advantages. The agenda is focused around five priority areas: economic competitiveness,

Chamber testifies on city's tax burden

The Fitchburg City Council voted in October to continue its gradual shift towards a balanced property tax, reducing the impact on commercial and industrial property owners by an unprecedented four points. This brought the business community's share of property taxes to 112 percent of the residential levy.

Massachusetts allows two models for property taxes: single and dual rates. The single rate means that both residential and commercial properties are taxed at the same level. A dual rate, however, dictates that one group--typically businesses--shoulders more of the burden and pays a higher share of taxes based on a property's assessed value.

A single rate tax system has come to be recognized as a key indicator that a community is open for business, and the Council acknowledged this at their annual tax classification hearing. Through a spirited discussion, Councilor Marcus DiNatale noted that seventy eight percent of Fitchburg's property fell under a residential use. If Councilors hoped to reduce the tax share carried by voters, the only responsible method would be to attract new commercial investment, as had been done with Great Wolf Lodge and GameOn Fitchburg. Maintaining a dual rate would only serve to discourage such efforts and perpetuate the root problem.

"Tax rates are only one factor in an economy, but a powerful one, and continuing to move towards a single tax rate would serve as a strong incentive for businesses to locate or expand in Fitchburg," testified Chamber President & CEO Roy Nascimento at the tax hearing.

Ultimately, the Council voted 8-3 in favor of reducing the burden on commercial property owners. For fiscal year 2018, the average commercial property owner with property valued at the average of \$318,096 will see a decrease of \$73.45 - had there been no change and the council maintained the 116 shift, the average increase would have been \$203.45. Industrial classified properties will also see a reduction

small business, manufacturing, education, and transportation.

"Our public policy agenda is focused on supporting a strong business climate and ensuring that North Central Massachusetts

remains a great place to live, work and grow a business," said Chamber President Roy M. Nascimento. "We look forward to working with our legislative delegation to advocate these priorities."


