The Community Leadership Institute was developed to support the access to region's many organizations, industries and business leaders as part of the succession plan not only for individual businesses but for the community at large in this 21st century technology and knowledge-driven economy.

### CLI Participants will:

- Refresh & renew their leadership skills
- Gain exposure to community resources that effect business and the economic vitality of the region
- Strengthen leadership skills to support a better community
- Engage in a dialogue with peers who see similar goals and challenges for the area
- Enhance professional network of peers through 9 month engagement

### Expected Outcomes:

- Adaptive, reflective and collaborative community leaders
- Business and community leaders with deeper, informed connections



### Successful Candidates:

- Demonstrate motivation and potential to lead within business or community
- Considered high performers in the organization and on a leadership track
- Seek to understand external issues facing the North Central region today
- Committed to the success of his or her sector and community; able to see beyond their own position to understand the influence she/he has on success of company and community
- Curious and interested in developing new relationships and open to challenging own point of view



### Eligibility and Selection Process:

**Eligibility:** Each year, the CLI accepts up to 25 participants from various industries and responsibilities within a Chamber member organization. We recommend that an organization sends no more than two participants.

#### Selection Process:

- **Nominations:** The Executive Sponsor (the owner or CEO of a member organization) should internally nominate one or two professionals to apply for the CLI program.
- **Applications:** Applications are available online at [www.northcentralmass.com/CLI](http://www.northcentralmass.com/CLI) and include 4 short essay questions. Applications are due by August 30, 2018.
- **Selection:** Applications will be reviewed by the CLI Steering Committee and applicants notified no later than September 28, 2018.



### Tuition:

Tuition for the 9 month CLI program is \$1,100 and includes all program materials, lunches and transportation (if applicable). New this year, CLI participants will also receive season tickets to seven executive breakfasts for additional educational opportunities. Four half-tuition scholarships are available and applicants seeking these should provide a letter of request.

### Commitment:

The CLI program runs from October to June with eight day-long sessions on various topic areas. Participants who commit to CLI commit to fully participate in all sessions. Companies that send a candidate commit to supporting their candidate's participation as to fully engage with their peers.
