### **CHAMBER updates**

#### INITIATE SMALL BUSINESS PLATFORM:

The Chamber has invested in a new online resource platform for members and NCMDC clients called "Initiate". The platform can be accessed via the Chamber's website and provides access to new tools, resources and bilingual supports to help small businesses grow in North Central Massachusetts. The Initiate resource portal covers topics such as money, marketing, management, and resiliency resources by using a variety of learning methods including videos, templates, and guides.

#### LAND BANK: The

Chamber has established the North Central Massachusetts Land Bank, Inc. as a new affiliate organization. The Land Bank was recommended in the One North Central Regional economic development plan and is intended to be another economic development tool that helps spur more real estate economic development activity in the region. Research indicates the Land Bank approach has been successfully utilized to support economic development in other communities and regions. In addition to providing the region with a competitive edge, this initiative will act as a major selling point for investment by clearing what can often be a major hurdle in getting projects off the ground.

### **REGIONAL BUSINESS INVESTMENT FUND:** In related news, the Chamber's

economic development arm – the North Central Massachusetts Development Corporation (NCMDC) recently launched a funding opportunity to provide low or no-cost loans to developers. The Regional Business Investment Fund (RBIF) is another initiative recommended in the One North Central plan to encourage more real estate development in the region. The funding can be used by developers for engineering, soft costs, site work, infrastructure and hard costs for specific developments in the 26 communities that make up the North Central region. The RBIF loan program differs from our traditional micro-loans and is intended to work in conjunction with other local, state and federal incentives and financing to encourage priority real estate development projects in the region. Documented support from the local municipality must be provided to be eligible.

### EMERGENCY RECOVERY EFFORTS:

Following the historic flooding that impacted the region in September, the Chamber and its affiliate organizations stepped up to assist local businesses that were impacted and to help with recovery efforts. We reactivated our dedicated email hotline help@northcentralmass. com – for businesses to contact us with requests for immediate assistance; we created an online resources page providing guidance and resources from local.

state and federal authorities; provided micro-grants to help impacted businesses; and established the North Central Emergency Relief Loan program to provide immediate funds for remediation efforts. The program provides up to \$10,000 with a 1% interest rate and all fees waived for eligible businesses and offers an expedited approval process with a quick closing. Loans are available up to six months interest only or deferred payments, then up to a 36-month repayment term with no pre-payment penalty.

jobs. The majority of the loans were through our traditional micro-loan program, however two of the loans were made through the new Regional Business Investment Fund to help support important real estate redevelopment projects in two communities in the region.

#### **TECHNICAL**

ASSISTANCE: In addition to the loans, our team also provided 2,706 hours of technical assistance and counseling to small businesses in the last year.



The NCMDC granted a \$32,000 loan to **Rise & Grind Café** and Smoothie Bar.

#### NEW LOANS: The NCMDC ended its fiscal year on September 30, 20

year on September 30, 2023. During the last fiscal year, our team closed 27 loans for a total of \$1,371,000. Of note, 85% of these loans were granted to historically underserved communities of minority, women, immigrant, or low income owned businesses. The loans ranged from \$5,000 to \$216,000. Our loans helped to leverage another \$1,085,779 in bank financing and owner capital and resulted in the retention/creation of 96

#### **MINI-GRANTS:** The

NCMDC continues to offer mini-grants between \$500 -\$5,000 to small businesses to assist with needed technical assistance. In FY2023, we provided ten mini-grants totaling \$35,288.93 to help with bookkeeping, marketing, signage and other professional services. The average mini-grant awarded was \$3,529. In addition to the technical assistance grants, the Chamber also provided another \$74,000 in Energy Relief Mini-Grants to small businesses. The energy relief grants were

generously funded through a contribution from National Grid. There are still grants available, so we encourage members to reach out to us to see if they are eligible. We are prioritizing chamber members for the grants.

AUDITS: The annual independent audits for the Chamber, the Chamber Foundation, and Visit North Central Massachusetts were all completed in November with no findings reported. The audit is currently underway for the North Central Massachusetts Development Corporation and is expected to be completed by the end of the calendar year.

### NORTH CENTRAL TALENT COMPACT: In

September, the members of the Compact met again to continue to explore collaborative strategies to the

workforce challenges in the region. The North Central Talent Compact is a coalition convened by the Chamber and other major stakeholders to address the complex talent and workforce challenges facing the region. An outgrowth of the Compact meeting was an expanded Career and Hiring Event that was hosted at the Mount Wachusett Community College in October. The event was a tremendous success, with an estimated 450+ attendees, including college students, high school students and a diverse mix of job seekers from throughout the region.

**MANUFACTURER BUS TOUR:** As part of National Manufacturing Month, the Chamber, in partnership with the MassHire North Central Workforce Board and Mount Wachusett Community College, held a regional manufacturer bus tour in October. In alignment with our Talent Compact, this event provided education, civic and community leaders, and economic development officials with

SOLAR: From its inception in August 2014 through October 2023, the solar field on Pleasant St. has produced 13,206,026 kWh of Net Metering Credits to the manufacturers participating in the program. Total value of these credits is \$3,154,043 and the collective savings to participants totals \$2,680,936. As one of the participants, the Chamber has received \$252,323 in energy savings to-date.

**WEBSITE:** The Chamber has been working to improve the Chamber's website northcentralmass.com - to make it a more dynamic and valuable resource for our members and communities. We have redesigned the homepage and several interior pages. We also have consolidated our economic development website choosenorthcentral.com into the Chamber website to make it easier to manage and avoid duplication.

#### **MEET & GREETS:**

The Chamber has been continuing to host our popular "Meet & Greet" series throughout the region. Our Meet & Greets are smaller, focused gatherings typically hosted by a member in one of our communities. They provide a great opportunity to engage with local businesses and get an update from the Chamber. The Chamber and NCMDC continue to prioritize efforts to engage more with Latinx business owners/ entrepreneurs and connect them with financial resources, programs and business networks. Latinos are the largest minority group in the region and increasingly playing a larger role in our economy. The Chamber recently hired Nicolas Berthet-Garcia as our Community Business Advisor who is dedicated to assisting our Spanish speaking business owners with Technical Assistance and Lending Guidance. ### GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS UPDATE-

#### FEDERAL AFFAIRS:

After weeks without a Speaker, House Republicans voted in Congressman Mike Johnson to be the new Speaker of the House at the end of October. Shortly after, the Chamber held its annual Congressional Luncheon with Congressman Jim McGovern and Congresswoman Lori Trahan. In addition to talking about the election of the new Speaker, the two addressed a number of topics including the potential shutdown, the housing and migrant crisis, inflation and the Chips Act. Thank you to Fitchburg State University for their continued sponsorship of this important program.

The Chamber continues to monitor a pair of bills, H.R. 2673 American Innovation and R&D Competitiveness Act of 2023 and its Senate counterpart, S.866 American Innovation and Jobs Act. This pair of bills aims to course correct a provision in the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act that set a sunset date of 2022 for a provision in the Tax Code that allowed firms to recognize all Research and Development (R&D) expenditures in the year that they were incurred. At the time of this writing, both members of our congressional delegation have signed on as sponsors of the House version, but Senators Markey and Warren have yet to sign onto the Senate Version.

Chamber staff also attended a number of New England Council events that have allowed us to connect

with other members of the Massachusetts congressional delegation including Congressmen Auchincloss and Neal.

### STATE AND LOCAL AFFAIRS:

In September, the Chamber gathered our state and local officials for our annual Legislative Reception sponsored by Mount Wachusett Community College. The event was well attended by the region's delegation. In addition to interacting with the state delegation, attendees also had the opportunity to interact with candidates running for office in the region's municipal elections.

In December, the legislature came to an agreement on a \$3.1 billion supplemental budget bill to close the books

on FY2023, which was held up over a disagreement on how to address funds needed for the state's shelter crisis. The bill ended up including \$250 million towards the state's emergency shelter system, funds to fulfill state employee raises that had already been ratified, and language to release critical tourism funding to the state's Regional Tourism Councils including Visit North Central Massachusetts.

The elections in November brought some change to the region's political leadership. State Representative Peter Durant won the special election to fill the Worcester and Hampshire seat previously held by Anne Gobi. In Fitchburg, Sam Squailia, councilor-at-large, was elected to serve as the next mayor. Shortly after the election, Squailia spoke to

the Chamber's Leadership Council about her transition plans and priorities for her new administration. Beth Walsh, who had previously served as councilor in Ward 6, will return to the Fitchburg city council as a councilor-atlarge. In Gardner, Carolyn Kamuda will join the city council as councilor-at-large, while David Thibault-Muñoz will serve as councilor for Ward 1. In Leominster. Brandon Robbins was elected to the council as councilorat-large and, following a recount, Bob Tocci was declared winner in the Ward 1 election. The Chamber has already begun efforts to engage these newly elected officials and inform them about our priorities and the Chamber's commitment to serving as a resource and an impactful economic partner.

Tn the fall of 1984 when ▲Anita Raboin opened Appleseed Personnel Services on Main Street in Leominster above the former Werner's Sporting Goods store, the North Central Massachusetts Chamber of Commerce had just merged with the Fitchburg and Leominster Chambers and opened its doors across the street from her office. And, like many new business owners in the region, Raboin knew the chamber was a good place to start to network and grow her business. "I walked into the chamber and met David (McKeehan) because I wanted to better acquaint myself with the communities," she recalled. "And that was my beginning to being a connected business owner in the region." In

addition to providing Raboin with contacts, connections, and networking, it was also her go-to place to find people seeking work opportunities while also serving as a resource. "I was an educator by training, so owning a business was completely new to me," she said. ### Economic & Visitor Data

ew economic **N**impact data for CY2022 was released by the state in the Fall and shows that direct visitor spending in North **Central Massachusetts** grew 39% to \$194.6 million, which represented one of the largest increases by percentage among the sixteen designated tourism regions in the state. The majority of the spending - \$185 million - was generated from domestic visitors, with the remainder from international visitors. Visitors to the region also generated \$12 million in state taxes and \$6.27 in local taxes. Room revenue in CY2022 was \$63.7 million, exceeding pre-pandemic numbers of \$53.7 million in CY2019 by 19%. CY2023 thru September 2023, occupancy was at 73.7%; room revenue was up 11%; rate was up 9.5%; and rooms sold up 3.9%! North Central

experienced an
estimated 3.66 million

trips in FY23, an 11% increase over the previous year, and 1,959,389 unique visitors, up 54.4%. Average length of stay was 2.6 days, up 13.2%, and 64.8% stayed at least one night. Our top origin markets were Boston-Manchester (26.5%); Hartford-New Haven (12.11%); New York (8.43%); Providence-New Bedford (6.1%); Portland-Auburn (5.77%); Burlington/Plattsburgh (3.82%); Albany/ Schenectady (3.21%); Philadelphia (2.24%); Springfield-Holyoke (1.66%); and Washington DC-Hagerstown (1.49%).

#### Advertising & Website

We continued to promote the region with a blend of print and digital advertising strategies across our targeted markets. To complement our paid advertising campaigns, we also launched a redesigned home page for visitnorthcentral. com in the Fall to keep the website fresh and inviting for visitors. We also continued with

our ongoing efforts to develop a mix of strong content for the website highlighting activities and businesses. As a result of our combined advertising and website improvements, traffic to the site increased 81% in the Fall compared to the same timeframe the previous year.

#### **Social Media**

We also continued to be very active on social media with both organic and paid posts on Facebook and Instagram. From July through November 28, 2023, Visit North Central Massachusetts' Facebook page had an impressive organic reach of 589,864, attracting 8,416 new followers. The page also utilized paid promotion with an additional reach of 495,273 and 1,550,722

paid impressions. On Instagram, the page achieved an organic reach of 62,448 and gained 1,222 new followers during the same time frame.

#### Shoulder Season Campaign

In collaboration with two other Regional Tourism Councils, we have started to implement an off-season marketing campaign funded from a federal grant. We have advertising campaigns underway with Hearst Digital Story Studio, Yankee Magazine and several regional publications. We have also hired CM Communications. a Boston-based PR Agency that specializes in destination marketing, to assist us with generating more interest in the

region among the travel media and other travel influencers.

#### **Visitor Center & Guide**

This popular publication is a glossy, full color magazine with pieces that aim to inform and inspire readers, and brand North Central Massachusetts as a unique destination and a dynamic place to live, work and visit. We are currently working on the 2024 Spring/

Summer edition. Members interested in advertising should contact the Chamber to reserve an ad. We are continuing to see strong demand for the publication.

Thanks to funding from several local cultural councils, we were able to successfully introduce a new series of cultural performances/ demonstrations in the Fall at the Johnny Appleseed Visitor Center to highlight local culture and attractions in the region. We also invested in new displays and some new artwork.




